 first and principally of good and bequithable my soule into the hands of the eternal
 God wherewith created and redde me with the most precious blood of his sonne
 Jesus Christ And my body to be buried in the Church of Maltby West of a
 certain church and make my brother Roger Fytwell of Bramley Grange in
 the parish of Braywell my sole and full executor of this my will and testament
 Item I give and bequith by my will all my lands in Maltby with the tithes
 to my brother Roger Fytwell and his heirs which were lately purchased of a
 certain merchant and lately the lands and tithes of Ralph Fytwell gentleman a
 late deceased And also all other lands that were purchased of Robert Crooke of
 Lambwicks Grange And also all other lands that were purchased of Sir Edward
 Sanderson Also all other lands that were exchanged with Thomas West Robert
 Fytwell through purchased by Ralph Fytwell and given by me by my will to
 my brother Roger Fytwell and his heirs Item I give and bequith by my
 will unto my brother William Fytwell of Bramley Grange in the parish of
 Braywell in consideration of two hundred pounds of awse him with the interest
 the summe of Twentie pounds per Annum out of my lands in Dirstill lately
 purchased of George Fytwell and Alexander Fytwell by Ralph Fytwell
 lately deceased The rest of my lands in Dirstill purchased of Cotton I give
 and bequith unto my brother Roger Fytwell and his heirs my sole executor
 of my will and testament All my goods and Chattells of give and bequith unto
 my brother Roger Fytwell yielding and paying my debts and legacies as here
 after is expressed Item I give and bequith unto John Sanderson some
 of Bradet Sanderson for the pounds to be paid when he cometh at the age of
 one and twentie years if he so long live only consideration to be paid out
 of that monee for the educating of him Item I give and bequith to the
 poor of the parish of Maltby ten shillings Also I give and bequith to
 the poor of the parish of Stanton ten shillings to be paid within a
 year after my decease Item I give and bequith unto William Fytwell
 of Stanton ten shillings Item I give and bequith unto Catharine
 Fytwell five shillings Item I give and bequith to Bonewick Fytwell
 and his children five pounds In witness whereof to these my words I
 have set my hand and seal the day and year above written John
 Fytwell Seal and delivred in the presence of William Fytwell Thomas
 Dawson, Jo: Dawson.

This will was proved at London before the Judges for
 probate of wills and granting Administration lawfully authorized the
 ninth and twentieth day of November in the year of our Lord God one
 thousand six hundred fiftie eight By the oath of Roger Fytwell the
 naturall and lawfull brother of the said deceased and sole executor therein
 named To whom Administration of all and singular the said deceased
 goods Chattells and debts was granted and committed by being first
 sworn by virtue of a Commission issued forth in that behalf well
 said fully to administer the same
