Six hundred fiftie and eight of John Fytwell of Maltby in the Countie of York gentleman  
 fully and intirely in herte but of good and profit remembrance. The saids maner be thys for  
 p[er]petuall use and benefite of myn soule and the soules of myn bretheren and of myn soules  
 first and principally of good and bequethable myn soule into the hands of the iternall  
 God wherewith excites and sett me with the most p[er]ticious bloud of his sonne  
 Iesus Christ and myn herte to be buried in the Church of Maltby. And first  
 ordainyng, constitutynge and make myn brether Roger Fytwell of Bramley grange in  
 the parish of Braywell myn sole and full executor of this myn will and testament.  
 Item I give and bequeth by myn will all myn landes in Maltby with the lither  
 to myn brether Roger Fytwell and his herte which was lately purchasid of a  
 wigh fraunchise and lately the landes and lither of Ralph Fytwell gentleman a  
 late deceased. And also all other landes that was purchasid of Robert Crooke of  
 Lambwath grange. And also all other landes was purchasid of Sir Edward  
 Sanderson. Also all other landes wherewith I exchanged with Iacob West Robert  
 Fytwell through purchasid by Ralph Fytwell and given by me by myn will to  
 myn brether Roger Fytwell and his herte. Item I give and bequeth by myn  
 will unto myn brether William Fytwell of Bramley grange in the parish of  
 Braywell in consideration of two hundred poundes of awn with the interest  
 the summe of Twentie poundes per annum out of myn landes in Dyrthill lately  
 purchasid of George Fytwell and Alexander Fytwell by Ralph Fytwell  
 lately deceased. The rest of myn landes in Dyrthill purchasid of Cotton I give  
 and bequeth unto myn brether Roger Fytwell and his herte myn sole executor  
 of myn will and testament. All myn goods and Chattells I give and bequeth unto  
 myn brether Roger Fytwell. Yelding and paying myn debts and legacies as hert  
 after as is expressed. Item I give and bequeth unto John Sanderson some  
 of Bradget Sanderson for the poundes to be paid when he cometh at the age of  
 one and twentie years if he so long live only in consideration to be paid out  
 of that mouny for the educating of him. Item I give and bequeth to the  
 poore of the parish of Maltby ten shillinges. Also I give and bequeth to  
 the poore of the parish of Stanton ten shillinges to be paid within a  
 year after myn decease. Item I give and bequeth unto William Fytwell  
 Dyrer of Stanton ten shillinges. Item I give and bequeth unto Catharine  
 Fytwell five shillinges. Item I give and bequeth to Bondwike Fytwell  
 and his children five poundes. In witness wherof to these myn  
 have set myn hand and seale the day and year above written. John  
 Fytwell. Seales and delivred in the presence of William Fytwell, Thomas  
 Dawson, Jo: Dawson.

**This will** was proved at London before the Judges for  
 probate of wills and granting Administration lawfully authorized the  
 ninth and twentieth day of November in the year of our Lord God one  
 thousand six hundred fiftie eight. By the oath of Roger Fytwell the  
 naturall and lawfull brother of the said deceased and sole executor therein  
 named. To whom Administration of all and singular the said deceased  
 goods Chattells and debts was granted and committed. The being first  
 sworn by virtue of a Commission issued forth in that behalf well  
 said truly to administer the same.
